

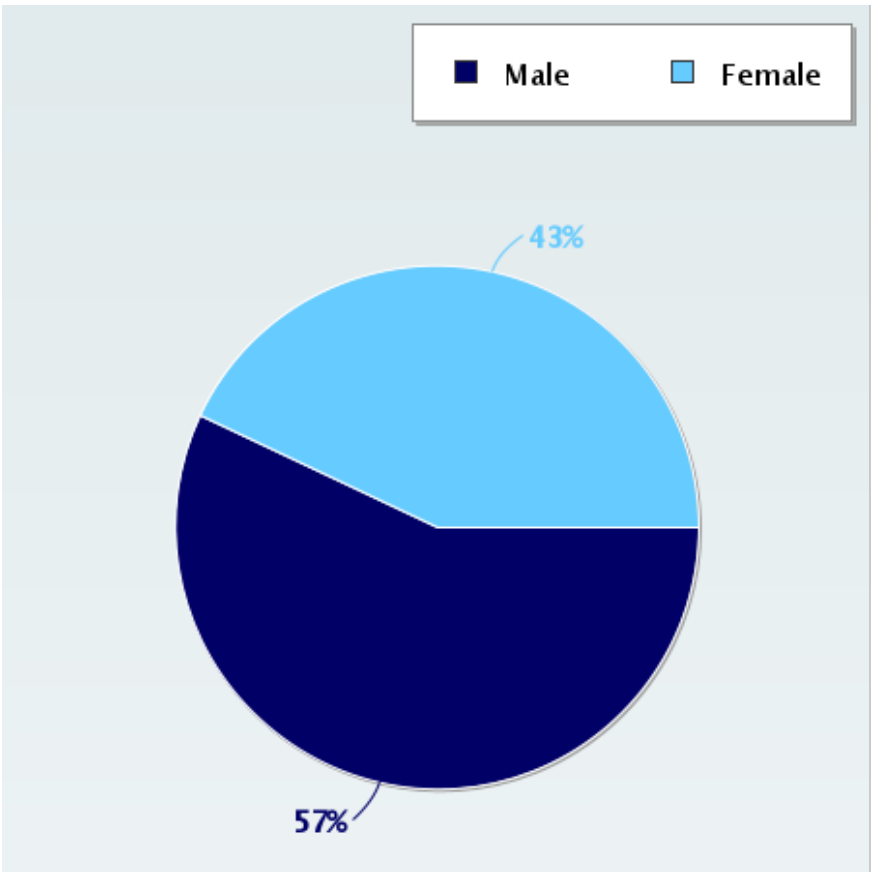

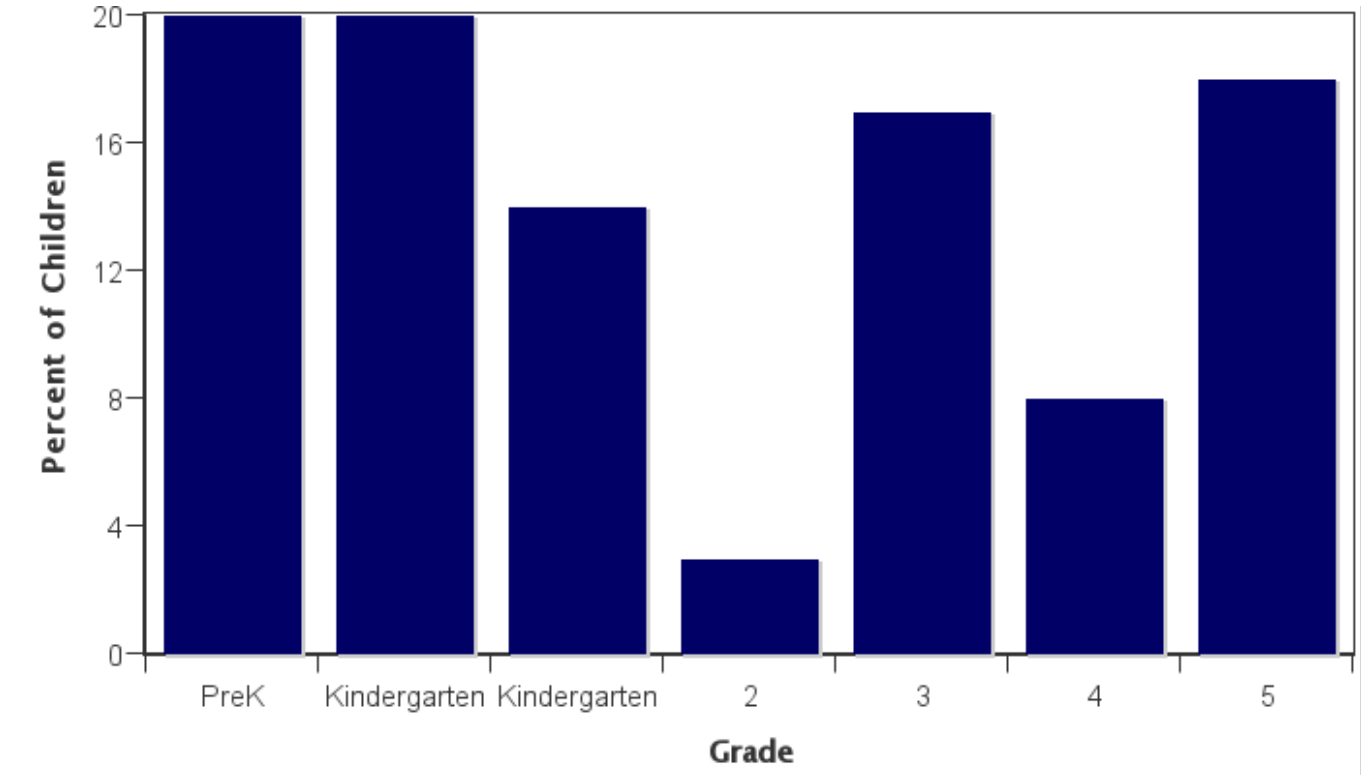

## Grade levels of children represented in survey



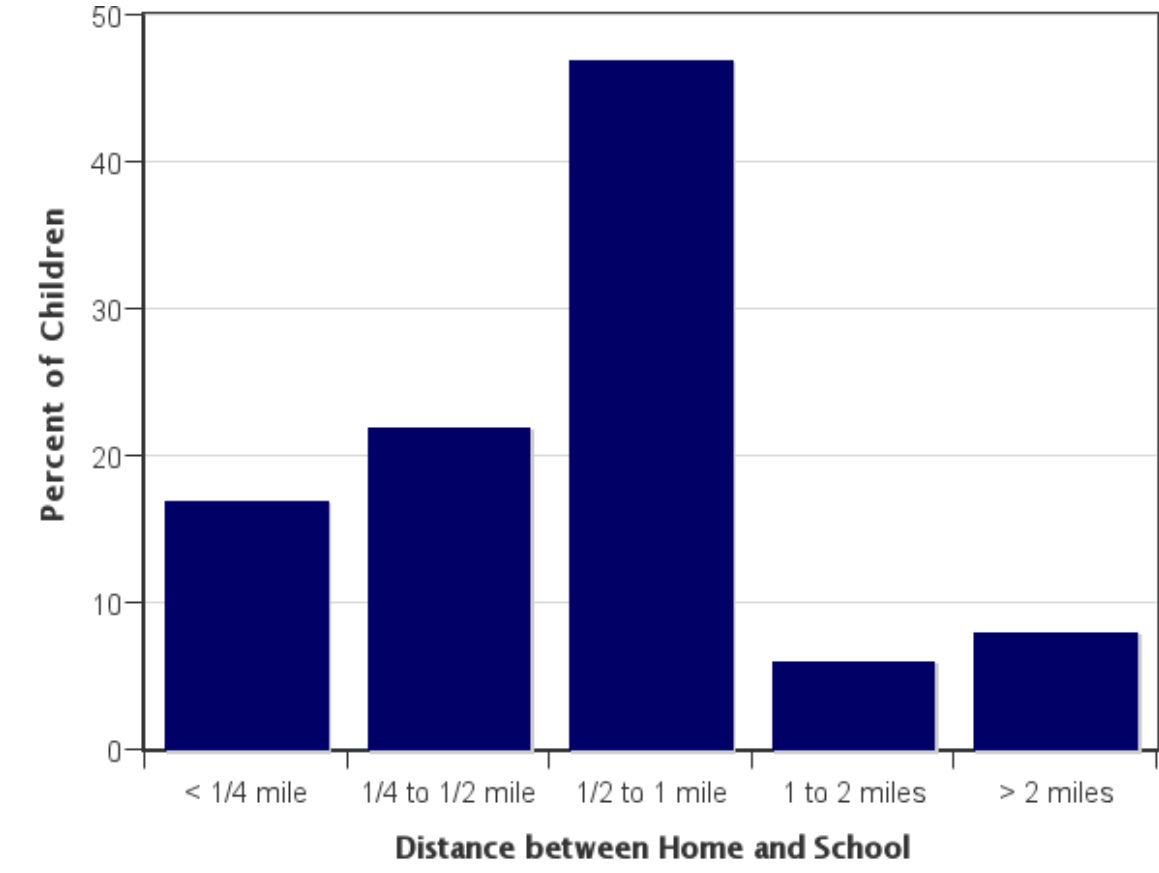

## Parent estimate of distance from child's home to school



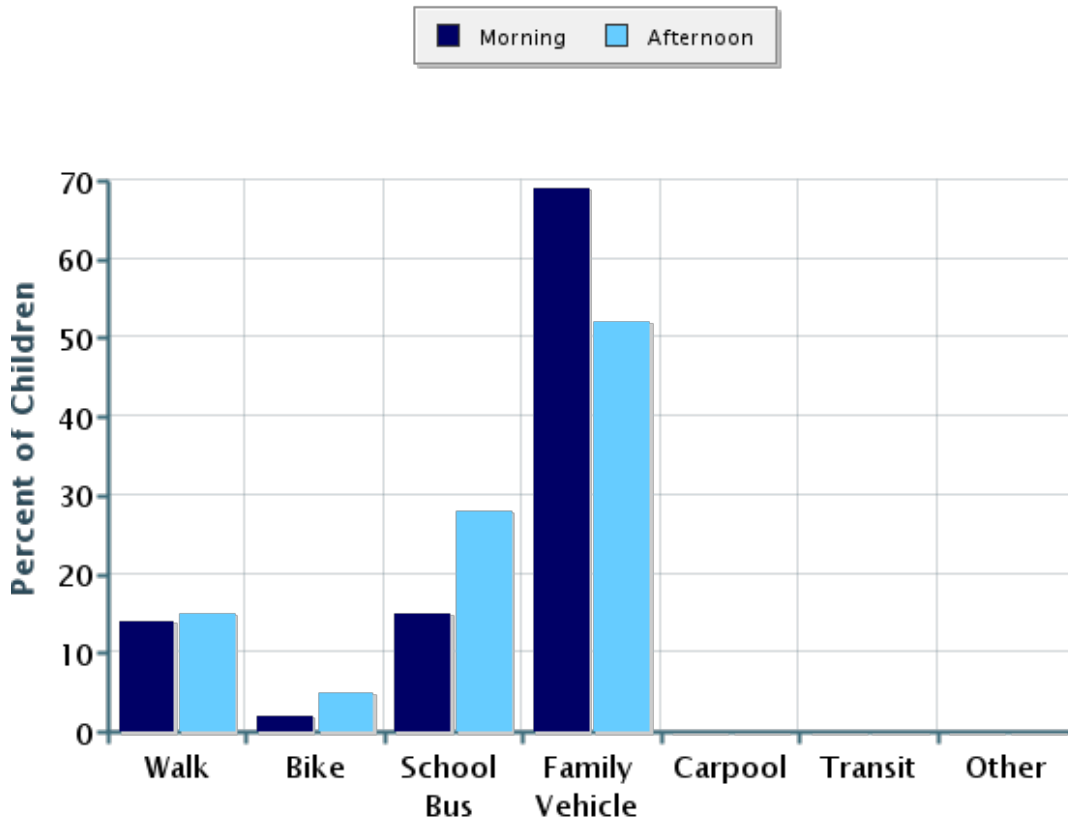

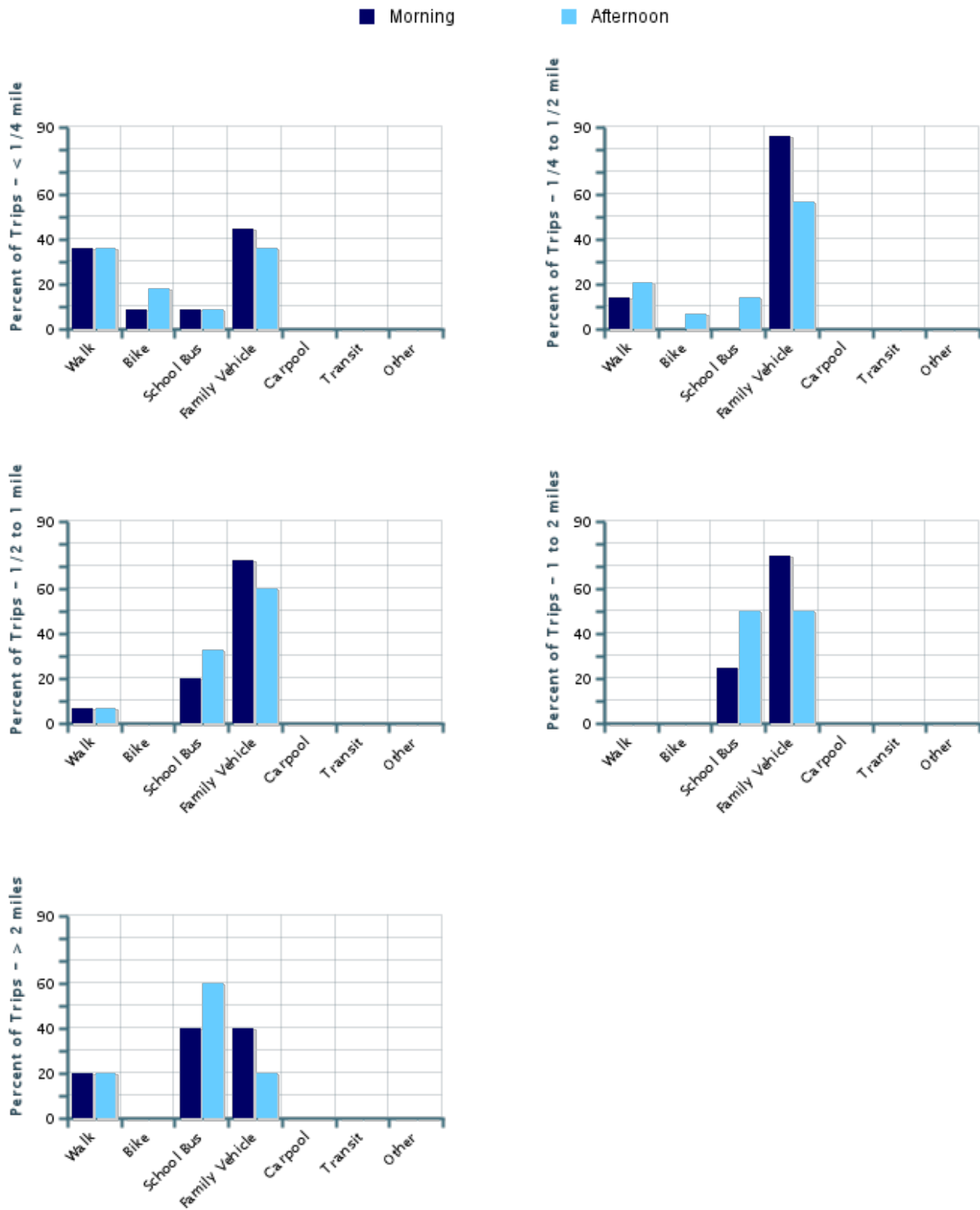

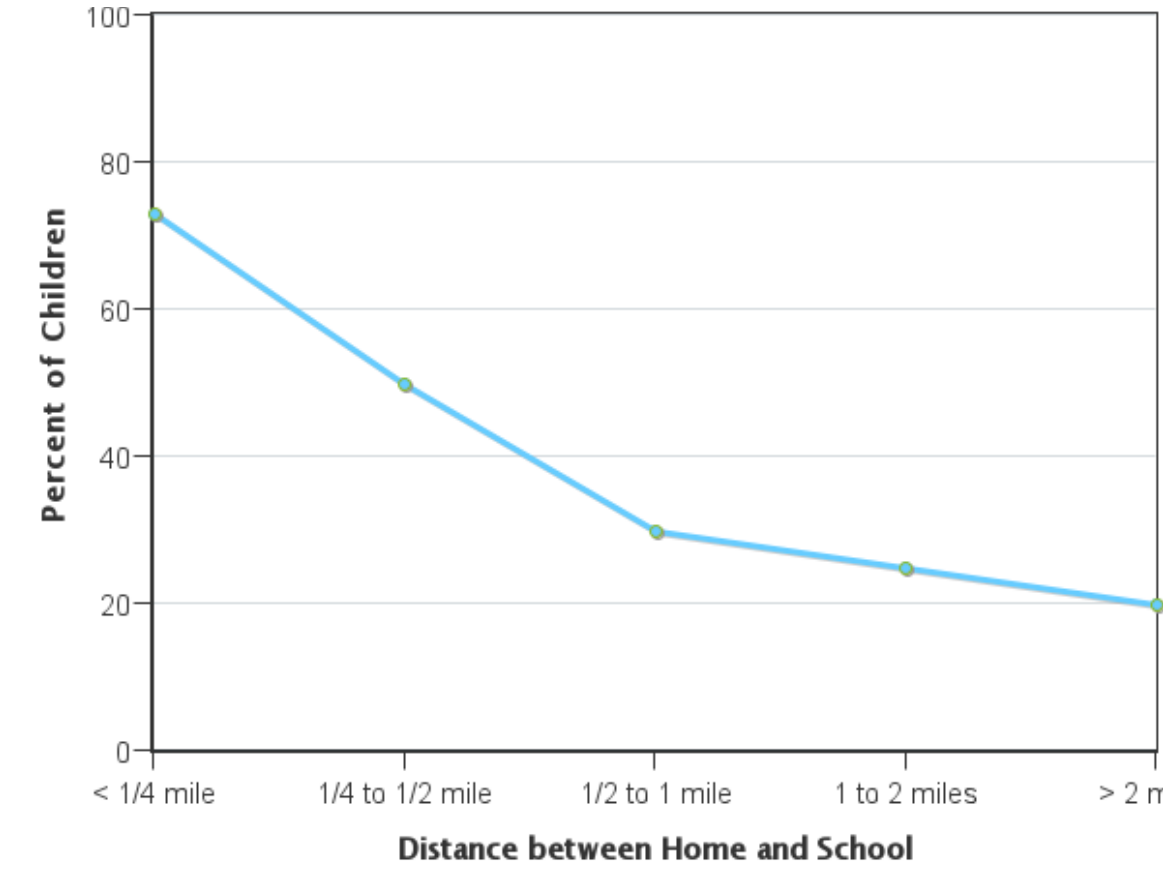

**Percent of children who have asked for permission to walk or bike to/from school by distance they live from school**



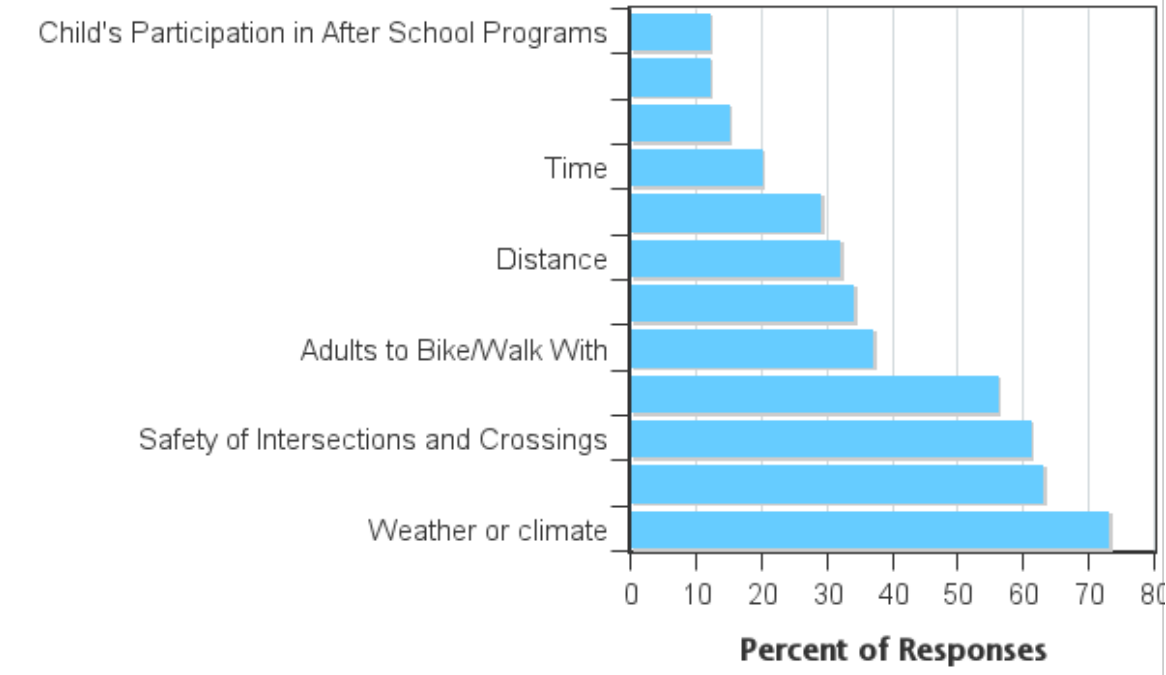

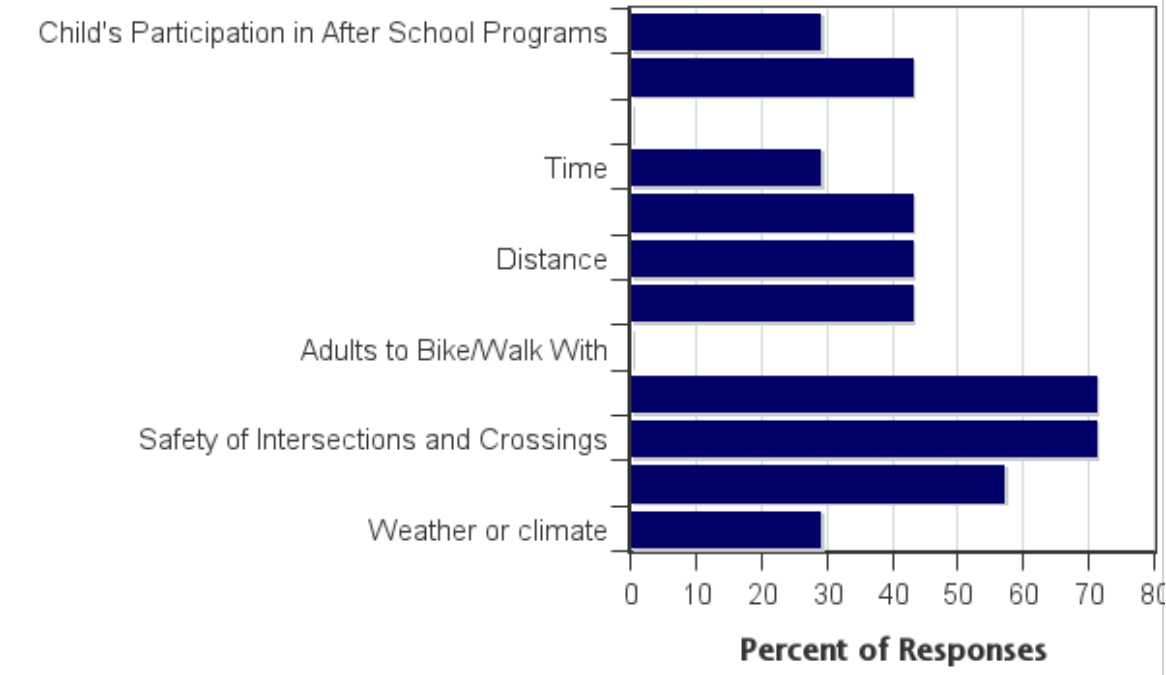

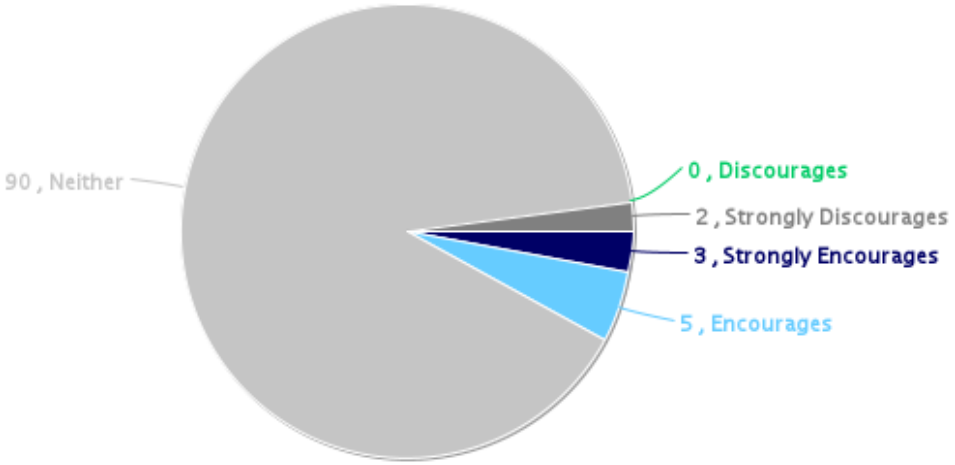

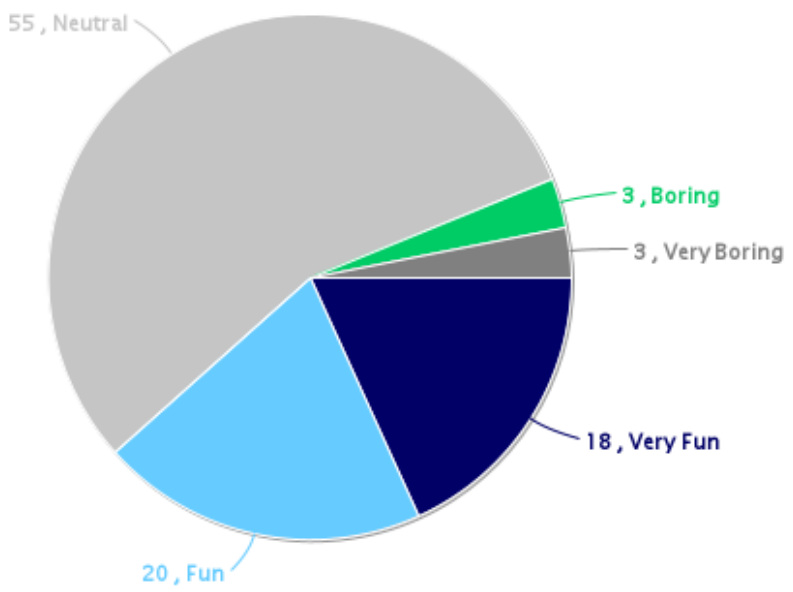

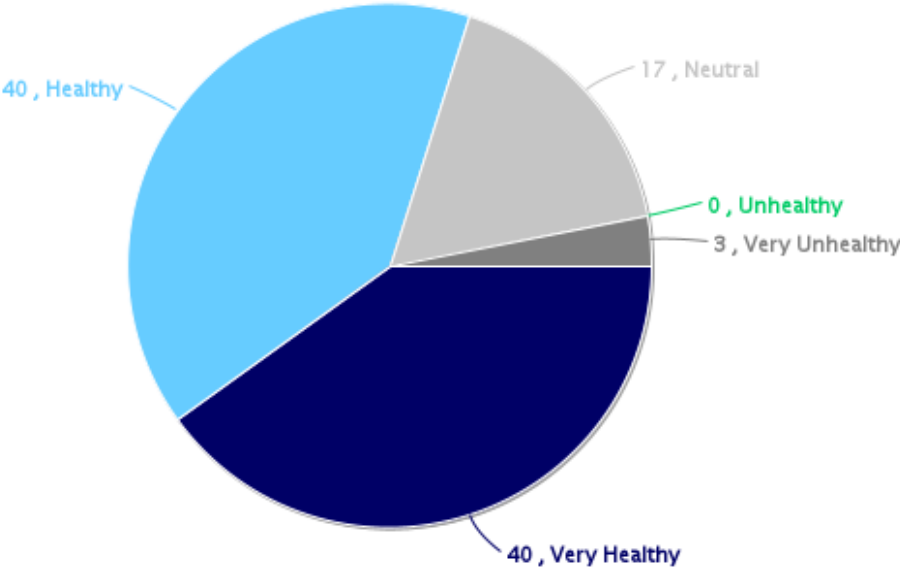
# Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school
